- The windbreak needs maintenance, as many of the plants are too close together preventing beneficial growth. Many (those that are too close) can be removed. Mulching of the windbreak is an on-going task, requiring frequent trips to the tip and spreading the mulch around plants. I would like to thank those individuals who make frequent trips to the tip and to those who tend to compost bays and much needed watering of communal beds (this includes citrus orchard).
- We now have 70 something members and 60 plots. I believe we have a waiting list. This is a really heartening thing for our small community and I would like to thank the committee members for their ongoing support of our community.
