4. General Business

1. Harley reported on the market stall held on Sunday 30th September. There were plenty of helpers to harvest and package crops on Saturday prior to the Sunday market. Despite the lack of produce (apart from very good quality spinach), it was a pleasant day with a profit of \$353 made. \$100 was from plant sales with pots of flat leaf parsley selling well.

The next market will be on Sunday 16th December where our garlic crop should sell well.

The Open Day at the garden the next day at 2–4PM saw 2 couples visit our site and sign up as members.

2. Harley tabled a card from Helen Nelson congratulating him on the appearance of the garden.

3. He has received a donation of gardening books from Lucy Gladwell. It was agreed that these would be placed on the shelves in the shed for all to access.

4. Harley discussed the cost of one plot as an example of what our set-up costs are for new members. The cost includes soil, sleepers, fittings, A 2 board plot costs \$148 and a 3-board plot costs \$222.

4. The discussion moved onto whether individual gardeners could top-up their plots from our purchased soil.

Sybille proposed a motion as follows:

“We agree that natural soil depletion in all individual plots can be replenished using the SoilCo veggie mix, when necessary”

5. Sybille reported that she has bought a pair of 2-handed secateurs for pruning windbreak plants. She has also pruned the acacia near the Hazelnut Grove.

6. It was reported that a member was seen loading our soil into his Ute from the piles adjacent to the gate. Other members reported seeing the same person frequently taking produce from the communal area. This member does not attend working bees or work in the communal areas during the week.

A motion was proposed as follows:

“The removal of soil off-site for personal use be mentioned in the weekly email and that members are reminded that this is unfair to all of us who work hard to raise money to purchase this soil. A letter is also to be sent to the member involved, signed by the President”.
